The Jeffrey Room is set under the magnificent dome and original marble staircase of the 1911 building and offers wonderful internal architecture and traditional features for a truly unique and spectacular atmosphere.

It is home to the Jeffrey Library, named after Robert Jeffrey, a wealthy cotton spinner who on his death in 1902 was found to have bequeathed his whole library including the bookcases to the Mitchell Library.

It includes first editions or sets of collected works by Dickens, Scott, Thackeray and other notable 19th Century writers. It also includes many volumes on Scottish history and Scottish literature which includes the Mitchell's first copy of a Kilmarnock edition of Burns.

However the main value of the collection lies in its many large volumes of illustrated works on natural history, travel, antiquities and art. These include works by John Gould, Bowdler Sharpe and perhaps the most well known, the double elephant folio 'Birds of America' by John James Audubon which contains 435 hand coloured plates with every bird depicted as life size.

The Jeffrey Room is also home to a Danemann concert grand piano and is often the venue for international piano recitals as well as being suitable for a variety of other events such as meetings, talks, and intimate functions.
