This tour highlights the gems your visitors won't want to miss, be it the huge South African steam locomotive or the 'Wall of Cars' or even the horse-drawn tram.

Glasgow has a proud history of producing ships, trains and contributing to engineering projects worldwide – see how some of those who worked these trades got around during Glasgow's manufacturing heyday.

See the trams the workers would have taken and see the fire engines called out for emergencies on this highlights tour of Riverside Museum.

The award-winning Riverside Museum sits on the banks of the River Clyde in Glasgow. Housed in a purpose-built, modern structure designed by acclaimed architect Dame Zaha Hadid, the museum celebrates the history of transport and travel.

The 3,000-strong collection reflects the important part Glasgow has played worldwide through its contributions to heavy industries like shipbuilding, train manufacturing and engineering. Visitors can explore the interactive exhibits, travel down a Victorian cobbled street, see a wide range of artefacts, from trains and trams to rare vintage cars, classic motorcycles, 18th-century boats hewn from tree trunks to a diverse collection of model ships.

Let our curators bring insight to a tour specifically tailored to your group's specific field of interest. With the curator clients gain access to the exhibits normally cordoned off – they can clamber aboard the tram! In small groups the curators have the time to address questions in detail and share their depth of knowledge with your clients.

Peppered with stories of Glasgow's remarkable history, guests can more fully explore their preferred area of interest such as:

Shipbuilding, ship models and maritime subjects – our collections and displays cover two centuries of maritime life on the River Clyde. Discover fascinating stories about shipbuilding, shipping and the making of the river.

Trains, trams and Glasgow Subway – come experience 150 years of Glasgow transport with a tour of the trams, locomotives and subway carriages that carried millions of people across the city and across the county.

Disability transport and technology – transport and technology has played a part in breaking down barriers that disable some members of society. Discover some of these objects: a hearing device used in cinemas, a Batricar mobility scooter, one of the first accessible cabs and others.

Glasgow's people – explore our replica old street, visiting some of the shops to discover how people in Glasgow once lived and worked. Discover our community-curated displays and hear about our ongoing work to bring new and diverse voices and stories into the museum.

Design – you'll be surprised by the variety of the objects on display in the museum. Exciting and innovative design spans the displays of transport items with often unexpected links. Find out how a Paco Rabanne mini dress worn by Audrey Hepburn, Bridget Riley's *Arrest III* painting, and a Zebra, fit alongside our exhibits of the Mini car, ship models and locomotives.

Horse-drawn vehicles – in the 19th century all road transport was horse-drawn. Wealthier people had their own private carriages, the equivalent of private cars, while others could travel on omnibuses, the forerunners of motor buses. Later in the century people travelled on horse-drawn trams. Glasgow's streets would have been filled with horses and the associated sounds and smells of hooves, wheels, and manure.

Collaborating with our neighbours at Clydeside Distillery, your clients will go on a journey of the history of our dockside setting – an area rich in comings and goings, where people started new lives and whisky was sent out to the world.

Start with a curated tour of Riverside Museum where your guide will take you through the history of the docks which played a significant role in the history of Glasgow and the UK. Learn more about the goods that were traded and the opportunities to come to Glasgow to live and work, or start a new life beyond the UK.

We'll then journey (2-minute drive / 10-minute walk) to the 5-star Clydeside Distillery, where a whisky cocktail awaits! Guests will explore the distillery's dockside story in their own time, discover fascinating tales about the birth of the whisky industry, featuring live footage and animation bringing history to life.

Next, a Clydeside expert will show clients around the Distillery, introduce the lively craftsmen as they handcraft whisky before it's barrelled and matured – using traditional methods and time-honoured skills with a spectacular view over the Clyde.

To round off the tour guests will sample the Distillery's new-make spirit, followed by two single malt whiskies.


Catering options at Riverside Museum
