Early Level, Primary 1

The Burrell's amazing Chinese collection is the focus for an active-learning session investigating Chinese culture. Learners will develop their team-work and research skills before delivering a short museum tour.

BY THE SEA

Early Level, Primary 1

This multi-sensory session is all about being at the seaside. After looking at paintings, children will have the chance to dig in sand and handle seaside objects. Then they will help us pack suitcases and come with us on an imaginary trip to the sea. Later they will meet Sammy the Seagull and his friends.

ANCIENT EGYPT: PASSPORT TO THE AFTERLIFE

2011–12: mid September–end October, mid April–mid May

Join us for a short walk in Kelvingrove Park, looking out for wildlife as we go. In autumn we look for coloured leaves, squirrels, seeds and life in the pond. In the spring we look for trees in bud, spring flowers, birds in song and ducks in the pond. **SCN 0-01a**

DARK, BRIGHT – OH WHAT A SIGHT!

Early Level, Pre-5s

Turn off the lights, grab the torches and let's explore! Children will investigate how light and dark paintings create different moods.

A fun art activity will conclude the session.

GLASGOW STYLE

Children will investigate how early 20th-century Glasgow artists and designers were inspired by the natural world. They will draw sketches in the Glasgow Style gallery, which includes the work of Charles Rennie Mackintosh, and then design a front cover for their sketch book. **EXA 2-07a**

What was life in Scotland like at the time of the Jacobites? Children will discover the answer, and learn about some of the important events of that period of history. 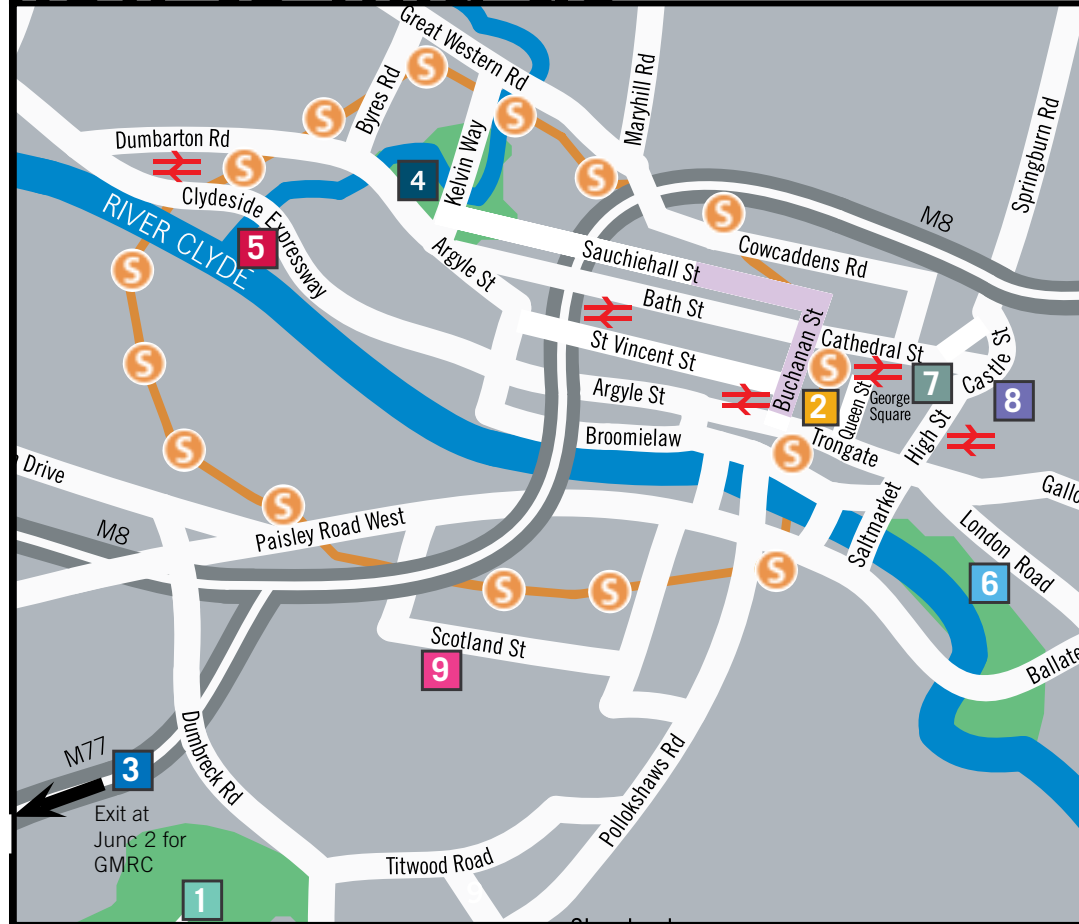
