On entering the library you will find the information desk.



Sometimes there might not be a member of staff at the desk but if help is needed, someone will come to help as soon as they can.

A member of library staff will be wearing a badge like this and will be able to help you.



To take out books you will need a library card. To get a library card you need to bring something with your name and address on it to the library. You will also need to fill in this form. Staff will be able to help you.



This is the quiet area. This can be found at the left of the information desk near the toilets.




There are also toilets that can be used when at the library and can be used by anyone visiting.
