

GoMA Library User Guide

The aim of this guide is to support children, young people and adults with autism to access the venue and the services it offers.

Welcome to GoMA Library. You enter through the pillars at the front.



To the right after entering you will find an information desk and a member of staff to help you.



Once you pass the information desk you will find 2 doors. The one on the left is for the library.



There is a narrow staircase that leads to the library.



Once you come down the stairs look for a sign like this to find the information desk.



This is the library information desk.



Sometimes there might not be a member of staff at the desk but if help is needed, someone will come to help as soon as they can.

A member of library staff will be wearing a badge like this and will be able to help you.



To take out books you will need a library card. To get a library card you need to bring something with your name and address on it to the library. You will also need to fill in this form. Staff will be able to help you.



There are also toilets that can be used when at the library and could be used by anyone visiting.



The toilets are near the stairs you came down.

There are 2 quiet areas. They can be found at each side of the library information desk.



You can use the self-issue terminal to borrow books. Library staff can show you how to use it.



The GoMA Library can sometimes be busy with different shows and activities. It might be good to look at the website or call before coming to see if there is anything on.

Computers are available for use while at the Library. You can also use the free Wi-Fi.

There is a café that can sometimes be busy and noisy. You might also smell some food. You can buy things to eat and drink.

There is a shop you can buy things from.
