This is Glasgow Museums Resource Centre.



Come and have a look inside. The reception is straight ahead. A gallery assistant can help you if you ask.






Staff all wear a purple 'g' logo.



Adults will be asked to write their name on a sign-in sheet when they arrive.



This is the waiting area. There are seats. There is drinking water available.



These are the lockers. Bags and jackets cannot be taken into the museum store rooms. You can lock your bag and jacket here and keep the key with you.



At least two members of staff will show you the museum store rooms. You must stay with the staff members and the other people in the group. The staff will tell you which museum objects you are allowed to touch. Most of the museum objects are fragile so cannot be touched.



There are lots of corridors and doors. The corridors can be cold in winter.



The museum store rooms are called 'pods'. They have dull lighting, strong smells and noisy extractor fans.





This museum store room is called 'Pod 4 - Art'.

There are lots of paintings on racks and sculptures on shelves.



This museum store room is called 'Pod 5 - Natural History'.

There are stuffed dead animals on shelves. Some of the stuffed animals are broken or have missing eyes. If you want to leave this room, a member of staff can help if you ask.



This is the Conservation Lab. Museum staff look after paintings and objects in this room.




This museum store room is called 'Pod 13 -World Cultures'.

There are old weapons and life-size models of people.

You can wear white cotton gloves to hold special objects.





This museum store room is called 'Pod 8 - Maritime Technology'.




There is always a toilet nearby. Staff can tell you where, if you ask them.





There are lifts and stairs between both floors of the resource centre.



This is the activity room. Learning assistants work with school groups and visitors in this room.



This is the lab. There are bright lights and you might hear echoes. Learning assistants work with school groups and visitors in this room.



The fire alarm makes a loud siren noise. Museum staff will guide you out of the building through a fire exit. Do not go back inside the building unless a member of museum staff tells you that it is safe.
