Sensory Kits

There are sensory kits available to borrow from reception at the Gallery of Modern Art, St Mungo Museum of Religious Life & Art, and Riverside Museum. We are working with the autistic community to improve these kits which is why they are currently only available in three pilot venues.

Visual Storyboards

We are working on storyboards for Scotland Street School Museum and People's Palace which will be available very soon.



Quiet Safe Spaces

Going Green - The Drive for Efficiency

A new display inspired by James Watt, the Scottish scientist. Famous for inventing a condenser that reduced the amount of coal required to drive a steam engine, the display showcases his work in a modern-day context of energy efficiency and climate change. Central to the display is a Tesla car, Model S P85+ and a rare Honda Insight Mk1 from 2000.

It also demonstrates how we test air quality, monitor oceans and make personal statements about the environmental dangers our world faces. Going Green is sure to enthral visitors of all ages and will be an important talking piece for the younger generations.
