I accidentally ended up on the PATH programme but it was the best thing that could have happened for me. I am someone who has experienced bullying and discrimination, I have faced barriers in my career despite my background and qualifications. The programme expands our capacity to communicate with each other, lets you discover your common grounds with people as well as barriers. As BME, we are advocating for equal rights of all human beings, not exclusively BME citizens. I gained negotiating tools, learned about myself and how to create a dialogue with people. It can be difficult but it helps you come to terms with and put away any fear and anxiety you may hold from these difficult situations and people. PATH inspired me to try again, to aspire to show the skills I have and to use them to help others. I'm glad I did. Now I'm now involved on national projects, boards of public bodies, recently I became the chair of a national Equality Group and contributed to Scottish Government equality action plans. We can use the PATH programme to promote and advocate positive change and lives, showing our skills and the real contribution we can make in creating an open

and active community for all

I have never considered myself as having suffered from discrimination and as such hadn't considered joining PATH as I just assumed it was for people to learn how to cope with racism. start an open and honest dialogue about our experiences. We also learned new skills and techniques to enhance communication and gain confidence to use in our jobs. I have worked for the Council for many years and I applied to the programme primarily because it was independent and not run by the Council, therefore attendants were from multiple organisations (volunteer groups, charities and also from different departments across the council) and backgrounds. Gillian who facilitates and delivers the training is absolutely crucial in how it is received and its success. The physical environment for the learning was centrally located and of a high standard – this was important. Although I do believe the course itself is great and provides some really worthwhile learning, I think it's important to recognise that it's one part of a bigger solution to the problem. Not everyone who goes on this course will have had the same experience as me with regard to support from their immediate line manager. Similarly, there is a real lack of engagement from across senior management before and after the course. Advertising GCC's commitment to allow employees to apply for the course is welcomed. However, the lack of open engagement from the senior management team about the value of promoting equality and diversity and the impact of learning needs to be acknowledged by them and genuinely encouraged. To really affect change we need to improve what happens next, what we do with the learning from the course, encourage staff to effectively practice their informed learning to promote equality and support the effective change to organisational
