How to access the digital content

The programme will be broadcast between 7 – 18 June on a platform called VimeoOTT – glasgowlifetv.com. There will be a daily schedule and the content for each day will be released for viewing from 9am each day.

Every school and nursery will be provided with a login link which will enable teachers to access the sessions they wish to view.

A wealth of classroom resources for use in preparation for your classroom screening are available to download from glasgowlifetv.com via your Wee Write Schools Programme: Education Pass. There's plenty to choose from to help organise your lesson plans and activities. Once content has been released and broadcast it will be available for viewing on this platform until 24 September – so that's a full three months from the day of broadcast, which means if you are unable to login at the scheduled broadcast date, you can choose a date and time that suits you and your class timetable right up until the end of this term and indeed well into the start of the new school term in August.

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What you need to know about CfE – Experiences and Outcomes

Coming to our Wee Write sessions is a great experience for your pupils – hopefully that goes without saying! It is also a brilliant opportunity to meet Curriculum for Excellence experiences and outcomes and to develop the four capacities.

Pupils will be enthused about reading books; motivated to create their own stories, poems, plays and comics through writing and drawing; and empowered to share opinions and ideas through talking and listening. And beyond Literacy, there are many other curriculum links. Here is a small selection:

Festival involves...

- Learning about being a writer = HWB 0-20a/1-20a/2-20a
- Find information about the author or explore specific aspects of the book (TCH 0-02a / 1-02a / 2-02a)

The book that is the focus of the session you attend will open other opportunities too. The circumstances of the characters, the historical and geographical setting and technology (real and/ or imaginary) can all be explored so there is plenty of scope to build in social studies, health and wellbeing, science and technology.

Example projects in digital literacy include...

- Create a radio advert for the book or film pupils giving their opinion of the book and/or session (TCH 0-01a / 1-01a / 2-01a)
- Send a social media message to the author after the event to thank them (TCH 0-03a/1-03a/2-03a)

Example projects in expressive art include...

- Draw a character from the book (EXA 0-02a /1-02a / 2-02a)
- Act out a scene (EXA 0-01a / 1-01a /2-01a and EXA 0-12a/1-12a / 2-12a). Making props is also an option.
- Design an alternative book cover (EXA 1-02a/2-03a)
- Drawing/designing/animating can also be digital

To make your Wee Write visit the best it can be for your pupils, we recommend preparing by:

- Reading the book or at least as much as possible if it is a longer novel before the session,
- Building interest in the author and the book

End following up the session by:

- Checking if those questions were answered. If not, contact the author to ask
- Talking about the book (or finish reading it)
- Read other books by the author
- Spark discussion about what book each pupil would like to read next

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MONDAY 7 JUNE 2021 Coo Clayton Maggie's Magical Islands Pre 5 – Pr 2

Maggie's Magical Islands will take you on a journey around the stunning Scottish Islands, including Arran, Mull, Islay Lewis and Skye. The story follows Maggie and her Mum who have found an old map with a mysterious X marked on it. They travel by ferry across the Scottish Islands in search for the treasure and find something truly amazing as a reward. As well as reading through the story, Coo Clayton will share what it is like being an author and help explain how a picture book is made. There is a squirrel to spot on every page so you can guarantee some squirrel spotting too. There will also be an art and craft activity in this session where Coo will demonstrate how to make your very own lighthouse. The children will learn about different ways to travel, Scottish wildlife and island life. A perfect session to enhance any Scottish topic studied within the curriculum.



MONDAY 7 JUNE 2021 Joseph Coelho Zombierella Pr 4 – 5

Join Joseph Coelho, author of *Zombierella: Fairy Tales Gone Bad* as he shares how he writes decrepit tales and rotten stories with poetry at their heart. He'll share an extract from the story and show you how to write your own fairy tales gone bad!

In celebration of the 42nd anniversary of the pop-culture classic *The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy* by Douglas Adams, former UK Children's Laureate and multi-award-winning author and illustrator, Chris Riddell will be introducing you to Adam's world and the intergalactic (mis)adventures of Arthur Dent through this out-of-this-world live illustration event.
