



# Welcome to Sandymount Cemetery





## Glasgow Parks Code



5 mph ALL VEHICLES/CYCLES. Observe speed limit.

Dogs are welcome if they are kept on a lead and under control.



DOG FOULING This place falls within the terms of **Sections 1 and 2** of **The Dog Fouling** (Scotland) Act 2003. If your dog fouls in this place and you do not remove it immediately this is an offence and you may be issued with a fixed penalty notice or prosecuted and fined up to £500. "Lift it, Bag it and Bin it".



Cyclists are welcome in the park, but only on tarred footpaths and at a safe speed. Take due care around other park users.



Please use litter-bins provided or take your litter home.




Drinking alcohol is not permitted.

# Sandymount Cemetery

Sandymount Cemetery was opened in 1878, with the first interment taking place on 22nd July 1878.

The land was originally owned by 6 Glasgow businessmen who had each purchased identical plots of 4½ acres.

There are approximately 5,950 monuments within the cemetery grounds of which some 1,250 are Jewish and 350 Muslim.

The Jewish Section of the cemetery is largely self contained. It features exquisite headstones and, most notably, three tall rusticated branchless tree monuments. Sandymount Jewish Burial Ground is currently subject of an ongoing restoration

A principal feature of Sandymount is The Cross of Sacrifice, designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield.
