
















Western Necropolis

Established in 1882, the Western Necropolis took its inspiration from the Glasgow Necropolis and other so-called 'garden cemeteries' in and around Glasgow. It was one of several non-denomination cemeteries developed in the mid nineteenth century to address the huge demand for burial space created by the rapidly expanding city. Garden cemeteries, often sited on hilltops, were designed to be recreational spaces, where contemplation of death was made less painful by careful layout and design.

The Western Necropolis contains 355 First World War Burials, many of them contained in section P, with a small group in section N.

Glasgow Parks Code
